Dr. Frykman gave his approval for the new guidelines on head lice. Christine said that the committee would also need to look over the guidelines the schools would be using to make sure that they fit with the school nurses would recommend under the new policy no louse, rather than no nits. Christine said that there are some guidelines that have been recommended by the health department by the State as to how we should proceed depending on where the nits are on the hair shaft and how close to the scalp. Christine also said that research has shown that keeping children out of school with no nits is not necessarily going to save anyone. SBC have developed an agreement with the Public Health Department that allows Dr. Frykman to write prescriptions for you for the epi-pen. The Epi-Pen agreement isn't attached because changes are being made and will be completed within the next month. The law does state that we can get epi-pen for our sites that are first time episodes.
