Influenza Pandemic	Brenda Brennan RN, MS	Brenda Brennan, utilizing a PowerPoint designed by the AMA entitled, "Influenza Pandemic: Citizen Ready" program, reviewed key points designed to help the public prepare, provide basic life-saving support information for public health emergencies, and build physical and mental resiliency in communities. By taking action, there will be a delay in the spread of the virus and the spread of the outbreak. There will also be a reduction in the number of cases at the peak. Each individual's responsibility during the pandemic is to be vaccinated, to wash their hands frequently, to practice cough etiquette, to identify vulnerable individuals, to establish social networking for local updates, to get trustworthy information, follow the directions from public health officials, and to stay at home when sick. Separate sick people from well people and don't go to work or school when sick. Do not request a child get a note from the doctor saying that they have the H1N1.	<i>None</i>
