**D**r. Frank Randolph has been actively involved in the Medical Society and the California Medical Association for 22 years. He is a strong and consistent leader: SBCMS President in 2002-2003, a member of our Board of Directors, Nominating, Finance, Membership, Medical Legal, Communications, and Medical Review Advisory committees, as well as the Speakers' Bureau and our Legislative Commission/LOPAC Committee. Dr. Randolph is also a District 3 CMA Delegate and has participated in several CMA committees, including the Panel on Family Practice, the Committee on Aging, and the Committee on Medical Services.

Rated among the top of Dr. Randolph's greatest contributions is the San Bernardino County Medical Reserve Corps. In 2002, he initiated the interest for SBCMS to apply for federal grant funding to develop a SBCMS Medical Reserve Corps. Although his 2002 application was not funded, he persevered and was granted annual funding for 2003, 2004 and 2005. He initially volunteered to serve as the Assistant Project Director for the MRC Planning Committee and currently serves as the MRC Secretary. He has worked consistently since 2002 to bring together the knowledge and skills of many different health professionals to address public health crises. He has been instrumental in all planning and training activities for the MRC, including coordinating the merger, in late 2006, of our Medical Reserve Corps with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, further enhancing San Bernardino County's emergency preparedness and supplementing our county's health care system during a public health emergency.

During his SBCMS presidency, Dr. Randolph lent his expertise in Geriatrics in coordinating a successful program, "What You Don't Know About Elder Abuse." Co-hosted by the joint Medical Legal Committee of the SBCMS and San Bernardino County Bar Association as their annual dinner, and with the collaboration of the Elder Abuse Unit of the San Bernardino Office of the District Attorney, the program successfully explored the problem in depth and drew an attendance of over 100 physicians, attorneys, judges and other health practitioners.

Other organizations have also benefited from Dr. Randolph's leadership skills: the California Association of Medical Directors (California Association of Long Term Care Medicine), serving as their president in 1998-2000; the American Medical Directors Association, the American Academy of Family Physicians, the American Geriatric Society, and the California Academy of Family Physicians.

It is for his many years of generous support and participation in SBCMS and organized medicine that the members of the San Bernardino County Medical Society honor Dr. Frank Randolph with its highest award, the Nicholas P. Krikes, M.D. Award for Outstanding Contribution to the Medical Society.
